We launched TagTeam 1.0 in September 2012. TagTeam 1.0 does the basics: it lets users tag any online pages, create feeds for any tag or combination of tags, share those feeds in HTML, RSS, Atom, JSONP, Twitter, and Email, blend those feeds with any combination of externally-produced RSS, Atom, or Twitter feeds, remove duplicate records while merging their tags, and store all records for export and searching. As soon as we launched 1.0, we started working on new features. Version 1.2 should launch this week (perhaps before this report is posted online), and will offer a much simpler and more elegant user interface, a much simpler and more powerful search engine, and a bug fix to improve stability. The new search engine will offer true boolean searching, phrase searching, wildcard searching, and let users search for keywords and tags from the same box. The next priority after releasing version 1.2 is a set of features associating tag records with the users who tagged them. That will allow readers to subscribe to feeds based on tags, taggers, or both, and support a karma-based governance system based on participant behavior.
